I wonder if you belong to any groups, Brownies, Beavers, maybe a football team or a netball team or a swimming club, or maybe you're in a club that does art or dance or music, or something like that. Clubs and groups can be great, can't they? Because they give us a sense of belonging. We belong to each other in that group. They almost become a bit like a family.

Okay, so we have that earthly family, but Jesus is saying we need to be born again into a heavenly family where he is our parent, where he is our family, and an amazing invitation to be brother or sister to all the Christians throughout the world.

There's well over two billion Christians throughout the world. And if you accept the invitation to be born again into God's family, then all of those two billion, over two billion people become your brothers and sisters. What an invitation, what a possibility.
